

Her life takes an unexpected turn when she witnesses a squirrel, Ulysses, being sucked into a vacuum cleaner and emerging with unexpected powers. Together, Flora and Ulysses embark on an adventure that explores friendship, love, and the power of unexpected heroes. Adapted by John Glore (WFT's 2024 production of A Wrinkle in Time), Flora & Ulysses is based on the Newbery Medal winning novel by Kate DiCamillo (Because of Winn Dixie, The Tale of Deseperaux, The Miraculous Journey of Edward Tulane, and many others). WFT's Flora & Ulysses features an imaginative mix of heartwarming storytelling, comic book-inspired visuals, and an intergenerational cast of Boston-based performers.

The creative team, led by Director Joshua Rashon Streeter, have found the perfect marriage new technology, traditional theatre storytelling devices, and original puppets to spark the imaginations of the young and young at heart."

WFT is thrilled to have **Joshua Rashon Streeter** at the helm of this production, making his Wheelock Family Thetare Debut. "Flora & Ulysses digs into complex relationships and genuine friendships that represent the modern family," says Streeter. "Audiences, no matter their age, will see themselves in the piece. The characters are quirky, but each have honest and heartfelt elements about them that remind us of someone in our own backyard. This is truly a 'family theatre' play!"

Continuing its 44 year legacy of intergenerational casting, WFT introduces 11 year-old **Livia "Livie" Ketri** to audiences as Flora Belle Buckman, and welcomes back 13 year-old **Jack Baumrind** (*The Addams Family, James & the Giant Peach*) as William Spiver.

"I am honored to make my debut at the Wheelock Family Theater, home to some of the greatest productions in the Northeast," shares **Ketri**. "As a 5th grader, I read Kate DiCamillo's wonderful book and loved Flora's character, a witty and smart young woman, who is a "natural born cynic. I am inspired by Flora's strong personality and dedication to finding a lasting friendship."

"I am excited to return to WFT for the third-time," says **Baumrind**. "I read Flora & Ulysses when I was younger and I'm very excited to perform in a play version of a story I love. William was one of my favorite characters in the book, and I think everyone will relate to him, and his relationship with Flora - two friends that can be with each other no matter how they view you."

Joining Ketri & Baumrind in the cast are the best of Greater Boston's performers, three of which are making their Wheelock Family Theatre debut. **Cheryl McMahon** is returning to WFT having most recently been seen in its award-winning production of *Hairspray*. **Kayla Shimizu**, **Damon Singletary**, & **Chris Stahl**, will be familiar to regional audiences, having numerous credits throughout New England.

Stahl, playing one of the titular roles, Ulysses, will have the creative challenge of performing as an actor/puppeteer, a task he's mastered before. "Normally an actor just has their own body to tell the story, but in this case it's like having two bodies. There's a lot of trial and error to see what works and doesn't...but there's also so much imagination involved when working as a puppeteer, which is thrilling!"

"As a frequent member of the audience at Wheelock Family Theater, I have always loved the high quality of its shows and their broad appeal and accessibility to audiences of all ages and backgrounds," says Ketri. "I am excited to be part of a show that delivers an uplifting message of hope, kindness and friendship."

MEET THE DIRECTOR



Joshua Rashon Streeter

is an Assistant Professor of Theatre Education at Emerson College. As a theatre-maker, Joshua loves to make work that is aesthetically and narratively driven – playing with light, objects, movement, and music. He was a 2021 finalist in the Reimagine: New Plays in TYA initiative. Additionally, Joshua has directed Old Jake's Skirts (Emerson College), Edward Tulane (Emerson College), Freedom to Fly (Muhlenberg College), in addition writing Birds of a Feather produced by Arts on the Horizon. His teaching focuses on critical pedagogy, K-16 pre-service and in-service education, drama and theatre education, and Theatre for Young Audiences (TYA)/Theatre for the Very Young (TVY). Joshua's scholarship analyzes the pedagogies used in rehearsals and classrooms and considers the relationship between process and product in a creative experience.
